
















## **Lessons learnt**

- Awareness raising is difficult; other themes are more important
- Communicate the mitigation options with clear <u>preconditions</u>
- The effects of the measures has to be <u>measurable</u> for the farmers
- <u>Time</u> is needed to get the suppliers and dairy industry involved
- An <u>interactive way</u> of knowledge transfer (game) seems to be more effective than websites, factsheets and information meetings





## Follow up

- Agreement: more integrated approach with other climate issues: green house gas reduction, energy saving and renewable energy production.
- Significant role for the confederation of agriculture (LTO): they take the responsibility of getting the farmers involved
